

Restaurant Review by Peter Wells

L'Almacera - Teulada

This was the second “outing” for the A group and we decided to give this 17th century ex-jailhouse a try out.

It is located at the bottom of the hill just by the roundabout at the end of the main road through the town. There is ample car parking right in front. The current British owners have not been in charge long and gave us a very warm welcome.

Inside there is a lovely collection of alcoves where tables are set out and high vaulted ceilings and white stucco wall give a very cosy rustic feeling.

The “Menu del Dia” is 12€ at lunchtime but 15€ in the evening (I learned later that the menu and portions are the same!). Starters and the main courses had over 9 choices and between us we tried most of them. Without exception they were all top notch quality, well presented and brought to the table in a friendly welcoming manner. The sweets were lovely too!

Interestingly there were ample vegetables and potatoes supplied, which is often rare in Spain.

Apart from our party the restaurant was pretty empty of other diners (maybe the word had got out!)

The ambiance and location were excellent and it was hard to find fault. They have their own web site too at <http://www.almacera.eu/inde.htm>

Cost per person 15€ - 3 courses, bread, alioli and one (smallish) glass of house wine.
