TOWN COUNCIL OFFICIALS OBTAIN THEIR CITIZEN CARDS

Civil Servants from the Servei d'Informació i Tramitació (SIT) in Teulada now have new Citizens' Usage Cards, documents that offer people registered on the electoral role in Teulada-Moraira a series of benefits.

The mayor, Antoni Joan Bertomeu, was the first to obtain the card which features part of the silhouette of Teulada town centre and that of Cap d'Or. He was followed by the other councillors making up the town council.

The politicians went along to the offices to sign up for the card. A photograph is taken of the cardholder at the office and the card is created using a computer system

and issued on the spot at no cost.

The mayor reminded applicants that the card gives holders several benefits, and that it will serve as an identity document for carrying out transactions at municipal offices, a big advantage for European citizens. It will also be accepted on municipal transport, which is soon to be introduced in Moraira-Teulada, because it is compatible with the Mòbilis technology developed by the regional government.

"In future it will be accepted in municipal sports and cultural facilities and for electronic transactions on the Town Council internet page, because it will have a chip for carrying out e-transactions", explained

the mayor, who says that the idea behind this new project is to "improve services and simplify transactions".

Since the scheme was launched on 1 July, a total of 550 citizen cards have been processed, the first of which were issued to retired people in Teulada-Moraira.

TEULADA TOWN COUNCIL INSTALLS THE 2ND ELECTRONIC INFORMATION MUPI IN MORAIRA

Teulada Town Council has installed a "Mupi" system in the avenida de Madrid in Moraira. This electronic information system is designed to give citizens and visitors information about all local cultural acts, festivals and civic and institutional events.

Mayor Antoni Joan Bertomeu explained that the project was thought

up by the Communication area but is being carried out by the Council as part of its Modernisation plan. The council installed a Mupi in the Town Hall Square in Teulada in June, meaning there are now two in operation.

Bertomeu says that this panel, which will be managed by the company Impursa S.A., will be a new tool for all the Council's departments to keep the community up to date with all the actions and activities they are organising.

The Communication Department will be responsible for managing the devices using a computer programme that will allow it to update the information in real time in the lan-

guage chosen.

The "Mupi" is over three metres high and features an LED screen that can be read in both daylight and at night. It is covered by an anti-vandalism screen and the messages it conveys will be legible from any part of the avenida de Madrid, thanks to its strategic position.

THE mayor THINKS

Work has begun on the football complex of Teulada-Moraira. We are very enthusiastic about this Project which will vastly improve the sports situation in our Municipality.

The company also presented a series of improvements to roofs and seating and lighting, worth €85,917.12.

"The idea is that the entire complex will be finished by December and that residents and children will be able to enjoy these top quality facilities, because we should have high level infrastructures and this new project is a step in the right direction, said the mayor.

The contract to build football ground 11 will shortly be awarded with a budget of 810,00 euros. It will take 4 months to build and will be funded by the Plan for Productive Investments in Municipalities (Plan de Inversiones Productivas en los Municipios (PIP) (Plan Confianza)).



THE ON-SITE LAYOUT CERTIFICATE TO START WORKS ON FOOTBALL GROUND 7 IS SIGNED

The mayor, Antoni Joan Bertomeu, and representatives of the company commissioned to carry out the works, Elecnor S.A. have signed the on-site layout certificate that will enable them to start building football ground 7 in Teulada very shortly.

The mayor and representatives of the building company went to the current sports facilities to inspect the condition of the ground and ensure that there were no obstacles against starting the works before signing the certificate.

Bertomeu talked about how much the municipality wants and needs this project, because the current fa-

cilities have become shabby over the years.

This is why it has been decided to rebuild, expand and upgrade them. He also pointed out how the local community will have two new football ground, 7 and 11, bleachers, six changing rooms, a cafeteria, parking area and large green zone.

The mayor commented that football 7 will have artificial grass and that both grounds will be connected by a central aisle. The infrastructure will include six modern changing rooms between both grounds, new bleachers with platforms for disabled spectators, and a café in a strategic location between both grounds.

The total budget for the product is €427,499.98 funded by the State Fund for Employment and local sustainability 2010. Work is expected to commence next week, and will go on for the next four months.



FESTIVAL AND MEDIEVAL MARKET IN TEULADA



The streets of the historic centre will be transformed with dance, delicacies, traditional crafts and several of the activities that dominated medieval life and culture at the Medieval Festival and Market 2010 between 6 and 8 August.

At a press conference, the mayor, Antoni Joan Bertomeu, and the councillor for Culture and Festivals, Maite Vallés, announced the programme. This year will be the sixth time that the Town Council has organised the entire event, which will take place in the historic centre, a part of town that has just undergone its second urbanisation stage.

The mayor commented that this medieval festival "will be particularly important because it will draw attention to the work that has been done to improve the quality of this public space and make the historic centre more attractive. The neighbourhood has just been declared an Asset of Cultural Interest

by the Government of Valencia". The councillor for Culture and Festivals said that after two years the medieval festival will be back in its original site, because previous editions were relocated to the avenida de Las Palmas. She said that this year the festival would be given a special character to involve Sant Vicent, because this is the 600th anniversary since his arrival in Teulada.

With regard to the events programmed for this year, the councillor explained that on Friday, 6 August at 18.00 the market would be opened. For the first time this year there will be an official opening parade at 22.30 with a dramatisation of the arrival of the town's patron saint and his two miracles in the plaza dels Porxes.

Get ready to enjoy street entertainment courtesy of jugglers and acrobats, costume jewellery workshops and archery as well as drum making, an exhibition of lace making and a carousel with horses, among other activities.

With regard to the market stalls, the mayor commented that visitors to the market will be able to see goods for sale made by the stallholders themselves, such as fabric and leather bags, silk scarves, candles, wooden children's games, handmade soap, ceramics, costume

Finally, the councillor thanked the associations who support the event every year, including the l'Associació de Boixets, la Colla El Falçó and the Children's Festival Commission 2011 and said that she hoped that everyone visiting the festival would have a wonderful time, because the aim of the event is to "give importance to the historic centre and transport everyone back through the centuries with this medieval festival".
