### ***Wine Trip***

On Wednesday 10 June we are taking a day trip to Bodegas Vicente Gandia, the leading

winery from Valencia, and one of the top Spanish producers of still bottled wine. There will be wine tastings, and the opportunity to purchase any particular favourites you taste! There is also a newly opened souvenir shop with the chance to buy unusual wine-related gifts, as well of course as other gifts, all of a very high quality. This package includes the following:

1. Lunch in Restaurante El Tollo [www.hoteltollo.com](http://www.hoteltollo.com)
2. Wine Tasting in the underground barrel cellar
3. A trip on the wine train which takes you on a tour through the vineyards
4. Visit to the ancient "Finca"
5. Visit to the ancient winery
6. Visit to the ultra modern winery.

Lunch and transport from and to Moraira will cost 25€ per person, but this assumes a booking of at least 50 people. At the moment we have interest registered and some payments made for 24 people. If we cannot get bookings for at least 50 people, the Bodega will send a mini bus. This is more expensive, and will mean a price increase of 5€ per person.

### ***Valencia : Oceanografico and IMAX cinema***

Date 2 June. We have discounted tickets (18.60€ ) for entry to both Oceanografico and the IMAX cinema, plus coach travel, all for 28€. This is much cheaper than you can possibly do it yourself, so a good chance to take the opportunity to visit this amazing place. Oceanografico is the huge futuristic aquarium which 'invites us to travel through the main seas and oceans of planet earth', seeing many of the creatures who inhabit the sea. A standard IMAX screen is 22 metres (72 ft) wide and 16.1 metres (53 ft) high and some are even bigger. Because of the size of each frame, the quality of the massive picture on the screen is extremely high and gives a real sensory experience! We will leave Moraira at 9am, return about 6.30pm.

### ***Madrid***

A 4-day 3 night trip scheduled for 2-5 November. Travel via the plains of La Mancha to see the windmills of Don Quixote, then visit a bodega for wine tasting and tapas lunch. Arrive Madrid approximately 6pm. Next day take an orientation tour by coach with guide, then enjoy free time in the afternoon. Next day is an open day to explore Madrid, timed for Wednesday so the museums are free entrance, visit the famous Prado Museum, the Royal Palace, maybe do a little early Christmas shopping in el Corte Ingles. Next morning go to Toledo with free time there to explore, returning to Moraira after lunch. This is provisionally priced at 270€ because Madrid is expensive, but may be cheaper with enough people. The hotel is central and 3\* including half board, but no lunches are included.

### ***Family Skittles***

On the Benissa trading estate "La Pedrera", just off the N332, there is a restaurant/bar/skittle alley. There are over 16 different games based on a similar format to Pub Skittles in the UK with 9 pins in the standard game. The alleys are longer but the technique is similar to that of 10-pin bowling but the bowls (balls?) are much lighter. It is very suitable for all the family and is great fun.

Everything is electronically controlled so nobody needs to score. Game lengths vary but a good night would be about 2 hours of play with 6/8 players per lane which would equate to about 5/6 euros each as the cost is for each lane by the hour. There are only 4 lanes in total so it is never crowded but it would be possible to hire all lanes with about 24/30 people for a special event. A full bar and a restaurant are also available - *though German the menu is suitable for all Nationalities - but there is no obligation to purchase anything*. Both of the owners speak excellent English and Spanish and would explain the rules. They also have an electronic dart board!
