### NOMINATIONS FOR THE POSITION OF FINANCIAL AUDITOR

It was announced at the last General Meeting on 4th May 2009, that under the terms of our Constitution the Auditor can be appointed from within the membership.

We have previously used the services of an external Auditor, but it is now felt that the position should be occupied by a member of our Association, duly proposed and seconded, and elected by a majority of members at a General Meeting.

On this basis applications for the position of Auditor are now invited. The duties of the Auditor are not onerous, and will consist of an annual check of the statement of expenditure and income and confirming the accuracy of the Annual Accounts. These will of course be prepared by the Treasurer prior to the Audit. Accountancy skills are not essential, but it is expected that the proposed Auditor should have some experience of auditing or managing club or associations accounts.

### **Valencia : Oceanografico and IMAX cinema 2<sup>nd</sup> June**

Leaving from outside the Wok Restaurant opposite Moraira car park at 9am. Entry tickets are booked but there is still space on the coach if anyone just wants a cheap ride to Valencia for the day. ### **Wine Trip 10<sup>th</sup> June**

On Wednesday 10 June we are taking a day trip to Bodegas Vicente Gandia, the leading winery from Valencia, and one of the top Spanish producers of still bottled wine. There will be wine tastings, and the opportunity to purchase any particular favourites you taste! There is also a newly opened souvenir shop with the chance to buy unusual wine-related gifts, as well of course as other gifts, all of a very high quality. This package includes the following:

1. Lunch in Restaurante El Tollo [www.hoteltollo.com](http://www.hoteltollo.com)
2. Wine Tasting in the underground barrel cellar
3. A trip on the wine train which takes you on a tour through the vineyards
4. Visit to the ancient "Finca"
5. Visit to the ancient winery
6. Visit to the ultra modern winery.

Lunch and transport from and to Moraira will cost 25€ per person, but this assumes a booking of at least 50 people. At the moment we have interest registered and some payments made for 24 people. If we cannot get bookings for at least 50 people, the Bodega will send a mini bus. This is more expensive, and will mean a price increase of 5€ per person.

### **MADRID 2 TO 5 NOVEMBER 4 days 3 nights**

Going via the plains of La Mancha to see the windmills of Don Quixote, then visit a bodega for wine tasting and tapas lunch: arrive Madrid approximately 6pm.

Next day orientation tour by coach with guide, then free time in the afternoon. Next day is a free day to explore Madrid, timed for Wednesday so the museums are free, visit the famous Prado Museum, the Royal Palace, maybe a little early Christmas shopping in el Corte Ingles. Next morning go to Toledo with free time there to explore, returning to Moraira after lunch. This is provisionally priced at 270€ because Madrid is expensive, but may be cheaper with enough people. The hotel is central and 3\* including half board, but no lunches are included.
