

Restaurant Villa da Vinci

32 members of the Barcelona group enjoyed a lovely evening at the Restaurant Villa da Vinci on the 24th January 2012. The restaurant is situated on the Moraira-Calpe road, on the left hand side, approximately 2.5 kilometres from Moraira. There is a large car park in the front of the restaurant for patrons. The entrance leads to a spacious bar area where we were all greeted by our hosts for the evening, Bob & Kay Cope.



The spotlessly clean dining room had a warm cosy atmosphere and the tables were beautifully set out with white linen tablecloths and napkins and carver chairs at all tables.

Bottles of vino tinto were already on the tables on our arrival and chilled blanco and rosado soon followed, together with warm rolls and butter.

The 3-course menu was specially prepared for our group. The price of 20 euros included half a bottle of wine per person and a tip. Water and coffee were extra.

All diners had pre-selected their choices from a menu of 6 starters, 6 mains and 2 desserts. The starters included chicken pot pie, seafood lasagne, soup, salads and stuffed courgettes. For mains, the meat dishes were lamb or pork stew, sirloin 'da vinci' or Iberian pork roast. There were 2 fish dishes – hake koskera with mussels or salmon with lemon cream. There was no vegetarian option.

The majority of dishes were served piping hot, although two or three diners did comment that their food was only warm. The timing of courses was just right.

Location, service and ambiance were first class and everyone I spoke to thoroughly enjoyed their meal.
